Cameron Galloway is a social work major with a minor in criminal justice. One of Kentucky's very own, Cameron hails from the creative city of Paducah, where his family inclusive of his grandmother, mother, four sisters, two brother, and two beautiful nieces all currently reside and continue to play a pivotal role in his journey to success.

Cameron's future plans include attending the basic officer leader's course to complete commissioning as a second lieutenant in the US Army National Guard. He will also be attending graduate school, pursuing a dual master's in social work and law.

As an accomplished student-athlete in track and field and cross country, he worked diligently to acquire all-academic honors and all-conference honors and served as co-president of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. Cameron has thrived through various measures of campus involvement. He stands as a proud charter member of Omicron Delta Kappa National Honor Leadership Society and a member of Phi Alpha Social Work Honor Society, with further engagement as a Sports of Social Justice Civic Leader, 2020-2021 Newman Civic Fellow, and Thurgood Marshall College Fund Student Ambassador and Leadership Institute Scholar.

Having been in-and-out of foster care from age two to 18 (including 17 different homes), Cameron experienced a wide range of trials and tribulations such as bullying and emotional abuse. Yet, it was through these experiences that he learned the power of relationships and summoned the inner strength to develop a positive mindset and critical leadership skills. By recommitting at age 18 to the system, he became eligible for financial assistance that allowed him the blessing to pursue his dream of higher education — and thereby, providing another avenue for continuing to advocate for the rights of foster youth.

In particular, Cameron points to January of his senior year in high school when he was moved to a new foster

home out of town as a pivotal moment in shaping his mindset for success. Realizing the need to change his disrespectful and hostile demeanor and instead adopt a more positive approach to life, he committed himself to becoming known for making a room bright from the moment he entered. By finally embracing his authentic story, Cameron made it his personal mission to encourage others to do the same — believing that acknowledging one's pain can become fuel for beating the odds and appreciating how regardless of our circumstances, we can learn valuable lessons to advance us through life.

At this time, he took the first step to encourage and impact others by becoming an advocate for youth in foster care and joining Voices of the Commonwealth. As a result of his passion for civic engagement, Cameron was invited to testify in front of the Kentucky legislature and to speak at a signing ceremony for a foster youth bill of rights.

Cameron also clearly affirms the role that his faith has played in his accomplishments, proclaiming that God has blessed him with the mindset to now see the light in every situation. To him, God is truly the main factor in allowing for the ability to endure and overcome the obstacles that were placed in his life to avoid becoming another statistic in a book.

Finally, as a result of receiving transformational guidance from a mentor named Eric Crane and his social worker since age two, Anitha Davis, Cameron has made mentorship a fundamental priority for his tenure as Mister Kentucky State University. He knows firsthand the impact that one person can have on another, and he is dedicated to utilizing mentorship as a vehicle for uplifting our amazing student body. Cameron says that he is blessed to serve as Mister Kentucky State University and stand alongside the resilient and awe-inspiring Yasmine Harper. His life stands as a testament to the words of Denzel Washington: "You'll never know how or when you'll have an impact, or how important your example can be to someone."

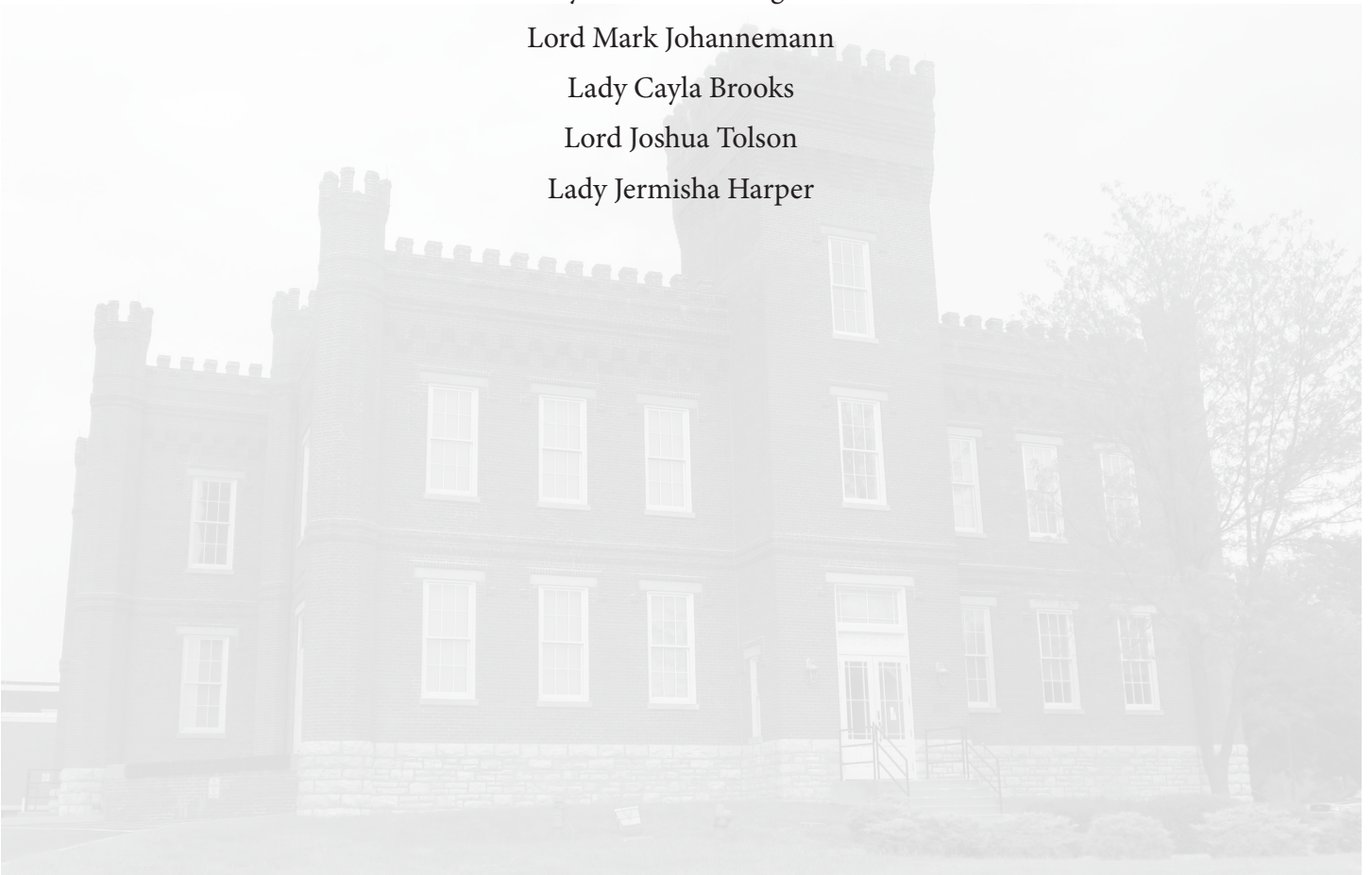
