

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#### **PROGRAM GUIDELINES**

The Kentucky State University Center for the Sustainability of Farms and Families (KSU-CSFF) Small-Scale Farm Grant Program was established to support the expansion of certain types of agriculture in Kentucky, especially among underserved groups. Grant funding decisions are based upon the future impact expected on the production and sales of Kentucky-grown and Kentucky-raised farm products.

#### **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

- A Kentucky-based farm with gross annual agricultural sales greater than \$1,000 and below \$250,000 in the previous two years. This is a self-declaration but must be verifiable.
- Kentucky-based, formal, non-governmental organizations and cooperatives that serve multiple Kentucky farms or producers (farm/producer names must be provided and verifiable).
- Special considerations will be made for:
  - limited-resource farmers (annual household income of less than \$23,000)
  - small acreage producers
  - female farmers/producers
  - minority farmers/producers
  - SOAR/ARC counties
  - IWG Energy Community county residents

#### RESTRICTIONS

- This grant does not fund start-ups (farms established less than one year ago).
- Applications are considered incomplete without the Category Supplemental Form and/or without
  quotes/estimates for requested items. Quotes can be online shopping carts or screenshots of items, as long as the
  cost of the item is visible.
- Late applications received after a stated deadline will not be included until the next review session.
- Individuals can apply for up to \$5,000 per application, with a lifetime limit of \$10,000.
- Individual funding is limited to one individual per household/address or farm number/address.
- Association/Non-Profit funding is limited to a one-time \$15,000 award. The proposed project must benefit
  multiple Kentucky farms and/or producers. Verifiable support letters from producers are required with the
  application.
- · All approved recipients must comply with all health, food safety, and other federal, state, and local laws.
- Kentucky State University employees and their immediate family members are INELIGIBLE.

#### **NON-ALLOWABLE REQUESTS**

- NO motorized vehicles or equipment (e.g., trucks, tractors, walk-behinds).
- NO labor costs paid to the applicant nor their relatives.
- NO consumables, disposables, expendables (i.e., jars, lids, labels, product packaging, seed, feed, soil, compost, live plants, fertilizers, pesticides, drip tape, etc.).
- · NO livestock purchases, including horses.
- NO partial funding of equipment greater than \$10,000. Equipment requests from \$5,000 to \$9,999 require a verified match.
- NO slaughter fees, water testing or other product testing fees, consulting or technical assistance fees.

#### **CATEGORY AREAS**

#### 1. VALUE-ADDED ENTERPRISE

- A value-added enterprise is the changing of raw agricultural products to a new product of increased market value (e.g., milk to cheese or lotions, grains to bread, etc.).
- Small-scale, limited-resource farmers expanding the marketability of their agricultural products by a value-added process will be considered for this category.
- Allowable items might include but are not limited to: cold storage, commercial kitchen equipment, appliances such as blenders, mixers, utensils, canners, ovens, etc.

#### 2. CERTIFIED ORGANIC AGRICULTURE

- Verifiable documentation of Certified or Transitional or Exempt status is required with the application. Allowable
  items included production-related implements, equipment, or supplies such as Jang seeders, handheld tools, walkbehind implements, irrigation, etc.
- Applications will be considered from organic farms currently certified by a USDA-accredited agency such as the Kentucky Department of Agriculture Organic Program and from farms registered with an accredited agency as Transitional or Exempt (i.e., all organic sales are through direct market channels and total less than \$5,000 per year).
- Organic applicants must understand and comply with federal laws regulating organic products.
- "Organic" is a labeling term indicating that food or other agricultural products have been produced through methods approved by the USDA National Organic Program. These methods integrate cultural, biological, and mechanical practices that foster the cycling of resources, promote ecological balance, and conserve biodiversity.
- Synthetic fertilizers and pesticides are not allowed.

#### 3. AGROFORESTRY/SPECIALTY CROPS

- Equipment and non-disposable supplies and materials related to the production, harvesting or collection, processing, storage, and packaging of non-timber forest products such as tree sap syrup, mushrooms, honey, medicinal herbs, fruits, nuts, berries, and silvopasture ruminant production.
- Excludes beef and dairy cattle.

#### 4. FOOD SYSTEMS RESILIENCY

• Continues to promote the production, sale and consumption of healthy foods in all areas of Kentucky, particularly those that have high levels of food insecurity. If a farmer or producer accepts Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) SNAP payments, or if products are sold at a farmers market that processes EBT SNAP payments, they will be eligible to apply for a mini-grant to support improved crop and/or livestock production and value-added product development (including fruit and vegetable production, aquaculture, poultry or eggs, and small ruminant production; excludes meat cattle or dairy cattle).

#### 5. EMERGING AGRICULTURAL TECHNOLOGIES (EAT)

• The Emerging Agricultural Technologies category will support farmers and producers in implementing emerging and appropriate technologies and/or practices that enhance farm efficiency, improve management practices and increase overall sustainability of the farm. The category is designed for experienced farmers and producers with existing infrastructure and ongoing operations. The two areas of focus for the category are Controlled Environmental Agriculture and Precision Agriculture. Each area of focus includes a variety of practices.

• Farmers interested in pursuing funding under the EAT category should reach out to determine project feasibility early in the application process. This category is designed for experienced farmers who are looking to improve already efficient systems of production in an effort to maximize resource allocation in their operations.

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### CAN YOU EXPLAIN THE APPROVAL PROCESS?

The Grant Review Committee considers all applications received by the stated deadlines and votes to recommend or deny funding, or pend for further clarification. The KY Office of Agricultural Policy (KOAP) determines final approval. Applicants may be subject to a site visit to verify the capacity to accept and properly administer grant funding. We notify approved recipients via email. Recipients must complete a Contract and other legal documentation provided by KSU. Upon final authorization, disbursement of awarded grant funds is via Direct Deposit.

#### WHAT ARE MY OBLIGATIONS FOR ACCEPTING GRANT FUNDS?

You will sign a legal contract that obligates you to use the funds as stated in your project description, and requires you to submit 4-month, 8-month, and Final reports outlining the impact of the project. Approved applicants are required to submit demographic information with reports. The Contract terms and conditions are specific to your project.

Failure to fulfill reporting requirements is a breach of contract.

#### HOW LONG IS THE PROJECT TIMELINE?

Recipients have one (1) year to fulfill the project aspects while submitting the required 4-month, 8-month and Final reports. Projects should be sustainable for a minimum of three (3) years beyond the project timeline. Reporting may extend for up to three (3) years beyond the project timeline to determine the scope of sustainability.

# WHY DO YOU NEED MY SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER AND/OR TAXPAYER ID NUMBER?

Grant awards over \$600 are considered income for tax purposes and must be reported as such to the IRS. Failure to submit the required information will disqualify you for grant funds.

# WHAT KIND OF SUPPORT CAN I EXPECT FROM KENTUCKY STATE UNIVERSITY?

We are dedicated to helping small-scale farmers and producers. We will provide relevant technical expertise from our Research and Extension faculty and staff and help you make connections with other local producers and/or specialists in your area.
